


Teams compete throughout Ontario and around the world (over 3000 teams worldwide) to qualify for the provincials and then to qualify for the World Championship in April.

Application Process Starts for Club Ronald McDonald Lounge

Marlene Mader is investigating how many members of our club would be willing to commit to a new Committee covering a 4 hr shift at the new paediatric lounge at the hospital. This shift would take place on a weekly basis with each shift covered by ONE of a group of volunteers accepted by the hospital.

Marlene is now at the point of ascertaining how many volunteers are willing to start the application process. This does not commit you to service at this point as we do not know which shift will be offered to us. Here are some key points to bear in mind:

- 1. Shift times are 8-12, 12-4 and 4 to 7:30
- 2. Volunteers assist in the day-to-day operation of the Family Room by providing comfort and support to the families and children who visit the room. Duties include greeting and assisting families, making coffee and putting out snacks, tidying and maintaining the space, and ensuring supplies are well stocked. No heavy lifting is required. Pushing a bar cart may be required.
- 3. The application requires proof of some vaccinations or blood work as well as a police check. Niagara Health covers the cost of the police check using a link provided online. The cost of any necessary medical testing is not covered.



If you are interested, please fill out the volunteer application online by mid-May at Niagarahealth.on.ca under Our Team, look for volunteers. This process needs to be started as soon as possible. Once you have completed and submitted the application, please let Marlene know and she will give your name to the volunteer coordinator. Your name will be pulled from the pool of volunteer applications and given preferential treatment. Marlene estimates that we will need 10 applications before committing as some may not be accepted by the hospital due to medical or other reasons. Others may not be able to accommodate the shift offered to us. Ideally, she would like to see a minimum of 8 accepted volunteers so that each one will only have to cover a shift every couple of months.
