CORAL'S INCOMING SPEECH

It would be a wish to continue in this vein, and perhaps team up with other clubs in the Global Grant process, focusing primarily on water. I look forward to the inspiration and projects that the committee will introduce. One project in the works is the investigation of the completion of the rail trail between Thorold and Fonthill. Bruce has been in touch with the Rotary Club of Fonthill, the Rotary Club of St. Catharines, and the Rotary Club of St. Catharines South to engage them in this project and there is considerable interest. He has also had discussions with the Town of Pelham, the Town of Thorold, as well as the Fonthill Lions Club - all who will benefit and help financially with this trail.

Is it fair to all concerned: We have extended our scope of service to include the Senior population of our community, and any service projects or ideas that need attention will be considered in this upcoming year. It is also my hope that our club will reinstate the Hybrid Zoom meetings for members who cannot attend in person for reasons such as illness, travelling, weather restraints, and advertising in the club newsletter, as well as using social media such as Instagram and Facebook to encourage prospective members to visit a meeting online. Hopefully this will encourage people to join in and see what Rotary has to offer to enable them to make the decision to attend a meeting in person, and perhaps join. Will It be beneficial to all concerned: Plans are in place to reach out to students at each of the 3 high schools that our club supports, to discuss the possibilities of student exchange and what the program has to offer. The St. Catharines Club and St. Catharines South are interested in collaborating with our club, and with support and input from Patricia and Al Scales in conjunction with their Youth Committee chairs, possibly sharing the costs of an inbound student for the year 2025-2026.

Will it build goodwill and better friendships: It is my wish that each member of Lakeshore Club will have an opportunity to introduce themselves to the club. a 2-minute introductory speech, to refresh our memories of the good things that we do in our lives, in our work, and in our community. This would be beneficial for the newest members of our club, as well as the oldies. One member per meeting, and each will be notified in advance, so be prepared. The Paul Harris Fellowship dinner was a huge success this year, with positive feedback from each of the clubs. The St. Catharines club has declined the continuation of the Joint Luncheon and are open to working with South Club and Lakeshore Club in another joint fellowship. This could be either a fundraising event, or just a social evening - an opportunity for our Fellowship committee to reach out and work with the 2 clubs in arranging this. Fellowship is an important part of our Club, to socialize and become better acquainted with each other, and their spouse/families. The Fellowship committee is working hard to keep us all connected on a personal level, and as a club we should support their efforts by joining these events as much as possible.

Finally, I wish to thank Annette for her year of presidency and guidance. She has filled at least a small part of her dash by giving joy to the members of Rotary Lakeshore. Meetings under the guidance of President Annette have been running smoothly, efficiently, and usually on time.
