Club Purchases Two "Hippo Water Rollers"!



The head of the United Nations food agency has warned that many countries in Africa are *"on the brink of a hunger pandemic"*. The goal of the 1000 Survival Garden Project is to empower 1000 women and their families in rural South Africa by helping them create food security and self-sufficiency through the creation of their own gardens. SURVIVAL GARDEN KITS have been created, and sourced, in South Africa including gardening tools, watering can, seeds and seedlings, compost and fertilizer. A key part of the kit is the HIPPO ROLLER, which helps move more water from source to garden in less time.

District 7090 CND Cluster Fund Selection Made



The Rotary Club of St. Catharines' proposal to provide much needed X-Ray equipment to a small rural hospital in Portachuelo Bolivia was selected by the District 7090 CND Cluster Fund in November. The Cluster Fund is a group of 13 Niagara clubs (**including our own Lakeshore Club**) that pledged to support a single Global grant in 2023-24, each contributing \$1,000 USD to its success.Through the magic of Rotary's *'multiplier effect'* the cluster's \$13,000 combines with District and The Rotary Foundation contributions to grow to \$31,000.

This new equipment and training would reduce the diagnosis time in emergency cases by 50% and improve access to diagnostic radiology services for low-income people and neglected residents. The total budget is \$84,000 USD.
