Emergency Grant Purchases Arrive for Food4Kids!

Through the efforts of Amber Hughes, Executive Director and our own Marlene Mader, the special Food4Kids order has been placed, and after the supplier was able to resolve some difficulties in sourcing some items, delivered to the Food4Kids warehouse in St. Catharines. Food Packages have been prepared and were delivered the last week in April.

As you may remember, formally a weekend food program only, the closing of schools (and their on-site food programs) during the Covid-19 pandemic has led to a needed expansion of Food4Kids to provide more food per child, augmenting their nutrition through the week as well. The Club received a \$1000 U.S. grant to assist the Food4Kids Program. The club matched the grant with an additional \$1000 U.S., above and beyond our usual level of support.

Foundation Profile of Dr. Jonas Salk, Inventor of Polio Vaccine



On March 26, 1953, American medical researcher Dr. Jonas Salk announced on national radio that he had successfully tested a vaccine against poliomyelitis, the virus that causes the crippling disease of polio. In 1952—an epidemic year for polio there were 58,000 new cases reported in the United States, and more than 3,000 died from the disease. For promising eventually to eradicate the disease, which was known as "infant paralysis" because it mainly affected children, Dr. Salk was celebrated as the great doctor-benefactor of his time. In addition, Dr. Salk insisted that his vaccine not be patented, so it would be available to all.

In honour of this past World Immunization Week (April 24-23), we recognize Dr. Salk for his outstanding achievement and his humanitarianism.
