## World and Community Spotlight Club Helps Tabitha Foundation Canada Supply Clean Water



The name Tabitha refers to a disciple in the Bible who was "full of good works and acts of charity". (Acts 9:36-42) Founded in Canada in 1994, the Tabitha Foundation supports aid efforts in Cambodia begun by Janne Ritskes. The Foundation's work focuses on the poorest of the poor in Cambodia, a country decimated by the Pol Pot regime in 1975-79 which promoted enforced starvation, mass executions and slave labour.

Working side by side with the people of Cambodia, Tabitha currently works with over 6,000 families representing over 30,000 individuals, in 10 provinces of the country. Since 1994, Tabitha has lifted more than 4.7 million Cambodians out of poverty and despair, into lives of dignity, hope and active participation in their communities. In 2020 only 3% of funds raised in Canada were used for administration. The rest of the funds are forwarded to Cambodia.



Most recently, the Club has supported Tabitha in the creation of fresh water wells. Although Cambodia is blessed with an abundant water table containing clean, potable water, much of its population is too poor to afford the construction of a water well. The environment exacerbates poverty, as Cambodians endure annual cycles of flood and drought. Skilled local well drillers are contracted in each project area. There is a 6 month complete warranty on all wells and parts are easily replaced locally. Families are trained in maintenance and upkeep. A machine drills down into the aquifer and a plastic pipe to the surface is installed allowing water to be pumped to the surface. Families then either save for a petrol-powered pump or rent a pump from a villager who has one. Field wells are constructed in the fields where crops are grown. Each well supplies two families with enough irrigation water to grow crops year round on an average of 4 hectares of land, along with water for daily living.

## **Record 50 at Sept. Group Blood Donation!**

A very successful 5th group donation! 50 spots were filled over 2 days, Sept 14/15. There were first-time donors and many that attended with family members. Soul Fire Yoga helped out promoting the event and filling many of the appointments along with putting together a giveaway pack. St. Catharines South Club had 3 Rotarians give blood including their president, Krystal Riddell.
