

Draft Planting Plan Being Developed!

After consulting with a variety of commercial landscape contractors and arborists in the area, the universal recommendation for an individual to assist us in the development of a draft planting plan for discussion was Alex from Gauld Nurseries. Gauld also had the advantages of being a commercial nursery used extensively by commercial landscapers for supply of their planting materials and has an outstanding reputation for highest quality, guaranteed plant stock.



Alex has agreed to complete the formal planting plan and budget at no charge with the understanding the final agreed plant stock (or at least the majority thereof) would be purchased from the nursery. The plan is now underway and will hopefully be ready for presentation by early September.



Food4Kids District Grant Approved!



Committee Chair Marlene is pleased to announce the District Grant we applied for (\$2000.00 U.S. from the District matching \$2000.00 U.S. from our club) has been approved and we will be starting to work on it next week.

Initially, the Club received a special Covid-19 grant for Food4kids for \$1000.00 US. An application for a subsequent grant required that we use the new funds

for students added from the time of the initial Covid-19 grant was awarded to the time of applying for this subsequent one. Therefore, under this later grant, we will be purchasing, packing and delivering food to 35 students for 8-10 weeks (depending on food costs) who have been added to the program. We also need to help pick up food from orders placed to stores or vendors.

World and Community Spotlight Isabella from Ryan's Bowl Updates the Club

Ryan's Bowl founder, Ken Walsh, went on a trip to Uganda with a non-profit organization in 2006. Seeing first-hand the poverty of the area and sad condition of the children he knew he personally had to do something. What initially started out as sending money to feed and care for five children, quickly grew into the organization it is today. In 2019, Ryan's Bowl fed 1,185 students, medically helped over 15 cases, supplied books/pens to over 100 children and gave numerous girl hygiene products to keep them in school. With the passing of Ken Walsh in March 2019, Isabella Bujor has taken over the organization but the organization's mission remains the same: to provide meals, education and medical care for the children of Mbale Uganda region who, without it, wouldn't be able to have basic necessities met!

Isabella is originally from Romania and her husband Billy from Albania; being able to have the opportunity to come to Canada for a better future and more opportunities they both have always looked at ways to give back to others. You can normally find her & Billy working at their restaurant called The Lemon Tree. After establishing the restaurant and having a few years under their belt, they were ready to take on another dream they had which was to dive into a charity to help kids in developing nations. When they met with Ken and spoke to him about Ryan's Bowl Isabella knew it was meant to be as their next step! Now having visited Uganda and meeting everyone she is excited to be able to continue on.
