Bakong Technical School

- Cambodia is a very poor country still recovering from 30 years of war ending 15 year ago. Over 2 million people killed and schools were virtually non-existent.
- Rotary District 7070 has been working for 4 years with Ronnie Yimsut a survivor at 15 of the Killing Fields to build a school.

Bakong Technical School

- The starting courses will be training for local people in bike, small engine, tailoring computers and hospitality business management.
- We bought chairs desks and a whiteboard.
- Peter Papp contributed \$500 for desks and sponsoring one student.

Celaya Mexico

- In the developing world an alarming number of children show up at hospitals with severe burns , eye infections and upper respiratory problems due to open-fire cooking inside small unventilated homes.
- Many women spend over 20 hours a week just gathering fuel-wood causing a loss of productivity and deforestation.

Celaya

- Ecological stoves are economical to build and operate saving 60% wood fuel while reducing the particulate matter and carbon emissions by over 70%.once the stove is light it emits very little smoke.
- Installing these stoves will save 18,000 deaths of women and children: savings in fuel cost \$5-10 per day and 19 million tons of wood will not be cut down.

Candelaria Schools, Philippines

- These schools manage the K to 12 program and are poorly financed by the Education Department and local Government. In addition there are 4 high schools with the same problem
- They do not have a science laboratory or equipment for teaching this subject i.e., computers and multimedia that the teachers require to support their training.

Candelaria Schools

- There are 29 schools to supply.
- Typical items are: microscopes, slides, various anatomical models, projectors, science glass wear, solar systems. centrifugal machines, educational CDs and laptop computers etc.
- Global Grant 2014/15 contributing to obtain \$42,000 of which Welland Rotary provides \$11000 US, Candelaria Rotary \$3,500.

Water Well

- We have carried over about \$10,000 from 2014-15 Rotary year to 2015-16 in order to fund (\$20,000) a Global Grant for a water well in a Bukal Barangay (district), Candelaria that will serve three villages presently without a water or a transportation piping system.

Fire Engine

- We have through Peter Papp's contacts obtained from Welland Fire Department a fire-engine for Sioux Lookout Ontario and which will be transported to Sioux Lookout in August 2015.
- We have meet with many difficulties in finding an available fire engine for Guatemala City and the problems of transporting it through Mexico ands US Customs; we will keep trying.
