Program—Eleanor Roosevelt (Molly White)

The intelligent and ever-quotable Eleanor Roosevelt was, not surprisingly, a talented writer. She wrote a widely-syndicated newspaper column ("My Day") from 1936 until her death in 1962.

In her column, she dispensed insight and advice on everything from the major parties' presidential election conventions ("all . . . are rigged to some extent") to then-major social issues, such as whether women should attend college (she was strongly in favor of the idea).

Due to her outspokenness, and sometimes controversial positions on various issues, Mrs. Roosevelt's FBI file was sizable.

In addition to writing "My Day," she remained active in public affairs well into her 70s. In 1958, she gave a noteworthy speech to the United Nations supporting the concept of universal human rights.

Roosevelt's involvement with the U.N. was substantial. She also served as a U.N. delegate and representative on the United Nations Commission on Human Rights
