LITTLETON — This year, the N.H. Fish and Game Department grabbed the national spotlight after being featured in a new series called “Northwoods Law,” which just finished its first season on the Animal Planet channel and could see a second.

On Wednesday, one of the North Country NHFG conservation officers featured in the show, Bob Mancini, of Sugar Hill, who is handler of Ruger, the region’s only K-9 dog, offered his perspective on the department’s challenges and what to expect for the future.

Because outdoor recreation in N.H. has become more popular in recent decades, Mancini foresees an increase in calls in two areas - search and rescue missions as more people enjoy the mountains, and enforcement of regulations for Off-Highway Recreational Vehicle (OHRV) as more towns open up more roads and trails for their use. Both could be a challenge for a self-funded agency that obtains

the money for its budget from numerous sources, including portion from sales of hunting and fishing licenses and registration of boats and recreational vehicles.

“As more towns open up roads for OHRVs, it becomes an enforcement issue,” said Mancini, who was guest speaker Wednesday during the weekly luncheon of the Littleton Rotary.
