Rochelle Rochelle began by thanking us for helping to raise money for the opportunity to attend the three exciting days of making new friends. She loved sharing the opportunity to learn about each other through the ice breaker activity and the talks and reflection on the purpose of activities planned for the three dayslearning, competing and having fun while working to develop leadership methods through group activities, dynamics and team building initiatives and problem solving and everyone having an active voice in networking around the variety of activities. Rochelle spoke of the participation of everyone in the Talent Show that orchestrated a huge confidence builder among them. Playing the ukulele and singing alone worked for her, as others achieved similar experiences, while having fun. Everyone was separated into teams to brainstorm and come together for a timed meal packing activity. The team combined efforts produced 10,000 meals packed in 45 minutes and shipped to the middle east where badly needed, thanks to the accomplishment of this 2019 RYLA class. The end of the conference was a speech delivered on the success of the three days, the importance of discipline and determination, setting goals, and most importantly, "lead by action, besides having a voice". The class of 2019 signed their conference book, and Rochelle received a recognition award for raising the most money of all the conference attendees. She also intends to apply action to her voice next year by applying for leading a polio fundraiser.

Many complimentary and congratulatory comments followed Rochelle's talk. Best of all, Kathy J suggested the prepared talk on her experience at a RYLA conference would make a great topic for next year's speech contest. We both spoke with Rochelle and family after, receiving thumbs up interest!
