Calgary Public Library- Louise Riley & Swimco

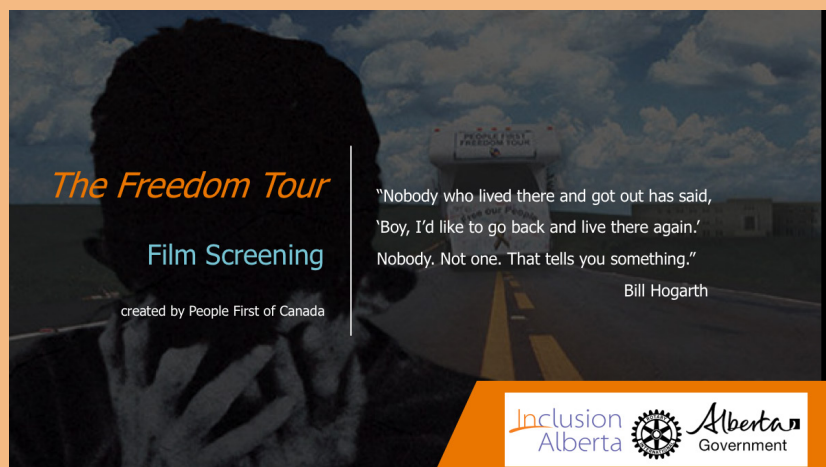
