# Programa de Becas Scholarship Program



The purpose of **Programa de Becas** is to provide the children of very poor families in the Puerto Vallarta area with the chance of a good education thus enabling them to have a better standard of living than has been available to most of their families.

The program began in 1996 when members of Club Rotario Puerto Vallarta Sur noticed that many bright young students were dropping out of school at age 12 after completing grade 6. In Mexico, at that time, it was mandatory that children attend school up to age 12 and many of the poor families could not afford to have their children remain in school past that age. If the children were not in school they could be out earning a little bit of money to help support the family and, even if they could not earn money, the family was not burdened with the costs of having the children attend school.

The program started with 10 members of Club Rotario Puerto Vallarta Sur sponsoring 10 poor students going into

Secundaria (grade 7) who would otherwise have had to drop out.



In 1997 it was suggested the Club approach visiting Rotarians and ask for assistance supporting students of the Programa de Becas and the results were overwhelming. Eighteen members of one Club in southern California offer to sponsor students and the program has just grown from there.

We now have more than 500 students sponsored by friends and Rotarians from Mexico, Canada, and the USA. Students are now sponsored through to the end of University.

To be eligible to receive a scholarship under the Programa de Becas, the student must remain in school full time and maintain a grade point average of a minimum of 8.5 out of 10. Student qualifications are assessed each year.

Due to the current economic climate we are running into a problem for the future of the program. Some of our sponsors have had to drop out of the program and we now have a number of students who have been in the program without sponsors. In addition, more students have been identified who qualify for the program, and there is a waiting list of approximately 150 students. As a result we are continually looking for new sponsors.

Funds are intended for the purchase of school uniforms and footwear, text books, school supplies and the payment of school related fees. The requested amounts do not cover all the student's expenses but, in most cases, it is enough to allow the family to keep the child in school. A number of sponsors do give their student extra money every year to assist with school related expenses.

When a sponsor joins the program, a specific student is assigned and the sponsor and student are "paired" for as long as they both remain in the program. The sponsor will receive a student profile with a photo, a brief account of the student's current situation and how he/she is doing in school, along with a Thank You letter written by the student to the sponsor.

The program has seen many students graduate University. Some of the University graduates would never have continued past grade 6 without financial assistance and, in some cases, encouragement provided by their sponsors. When a sponsor visits Puerto Vallarta every effort will be made by the Club to arrange a meeting between the sponsor and student. A number of close relationships have developed between sponsors and students in situations where Sponsors visit on a regular basis.
