SHERIFF.

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HARRY KIM

President Al introduced this week's presentation, a classification speech from our own Harry Kim.

Harry's family immigrated to Canada in 1967 from Korea, selecting Vulcan AB as a their first home and stepping stone to permanent home in Sherwood Park. Harry's father took a job as a mechanics helper.

After graduating from the University of Calgary in 1983 with a finance degree, Harry accepted a sales position with Canada Packers. In 1985 he was promoted to product manager, and in 1989



he transferred to Winnipeg. It didn't take long for Harry to realize that Winnipeg is not Calgary, and promptly moved back. During this time he accepted a position with Gainers in 1992 before returning to Canada Packers in 1994.

All this activity was, in fact, preparing Harry to start up his own company and in 2000, Harry and his partner started up Source Marketing to create and manage frozen food products, and to offer Canadian retailers an avenue by which to develop consumer driven food products. The company currently represents 30 manufacturers in Canada

Betty Little—a loonie to celebrate winning last week's 50/50 jackpot, and another loonie for spending time with her sister.

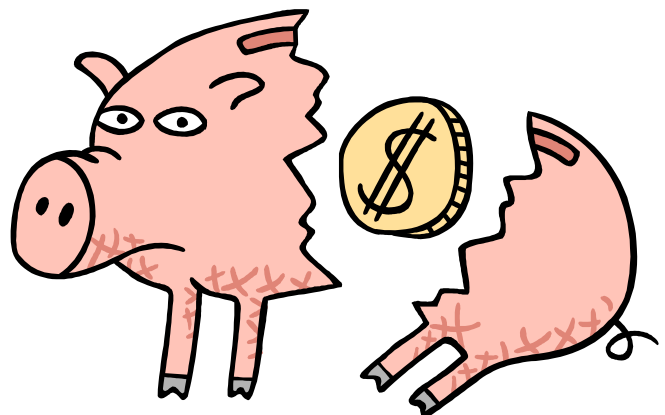
Doug Hood—a loonie in recognition of his daughter winning top grades for the second year in a row, and another loonie for a great time he had in California where his daughter gave a performance.

President Al thanked Harry for his delightful presentation.



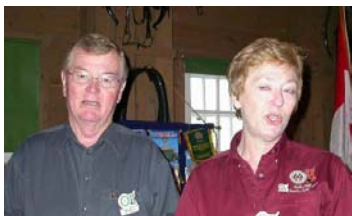
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50/50 DRAW
