PINE CREEK WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

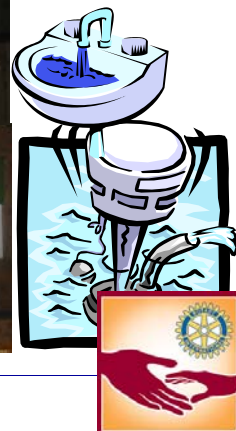


Alex Mc Dougall with the type of enthusiasm only an engineer can muster, introduced our guest speaker, Jim Miller

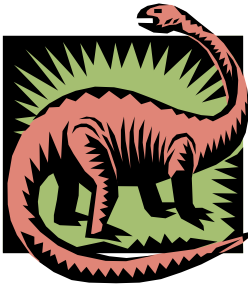


SUNSHINE

Doug Hood announced Robert Drew and Peter Harding shared the birthday of May 14th and are about as close in age as they are in hair styles.

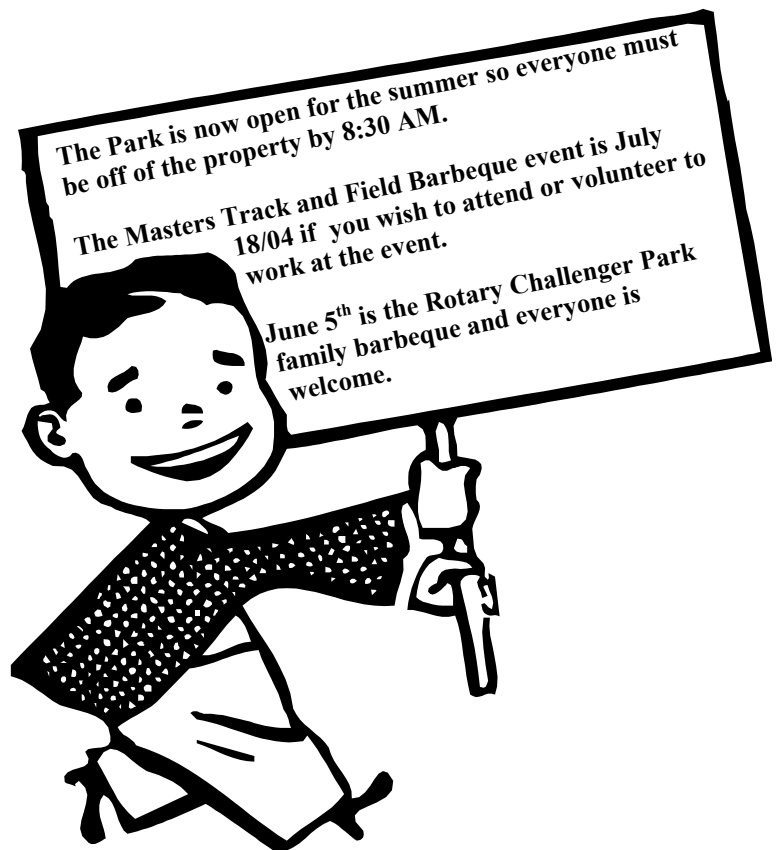


Al Hardstaff celebrates his birthday on May 19th and has a few more hairs than Peter but a lot more years than Robert.
