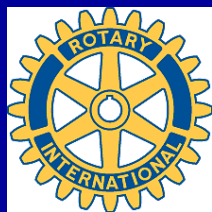


6th ANNUAL WINE FESTIVAL

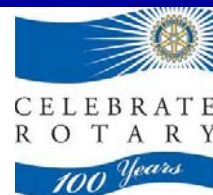

Calgary West through Ted Valentine is selling Northern Lights History.

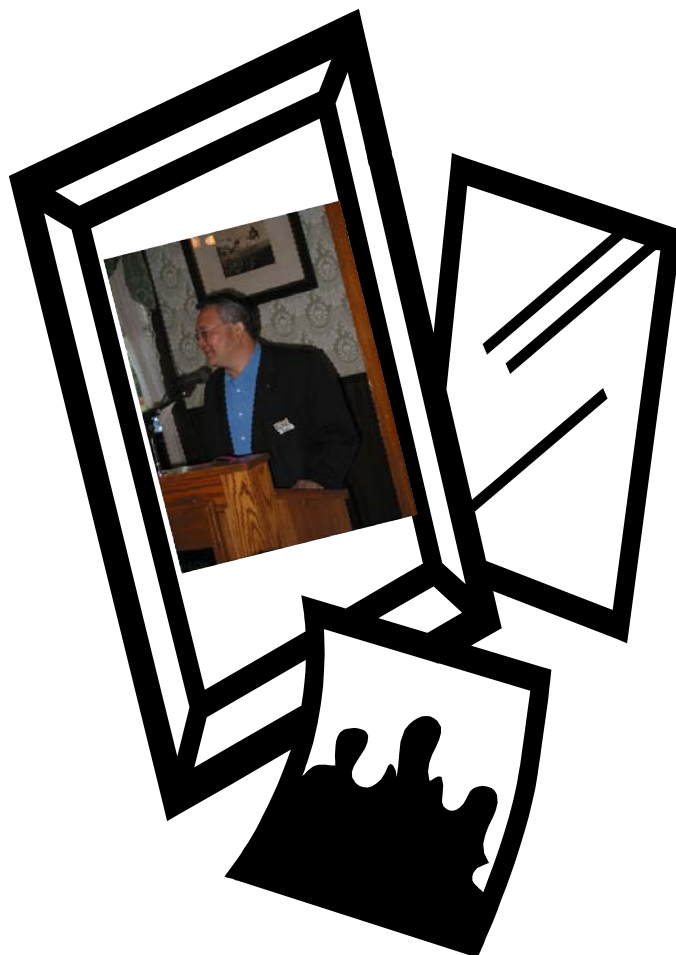
Calgary West is also creating a Seniors Resources Centre, which will offer drivers to take seniors to medical and other appointments.
