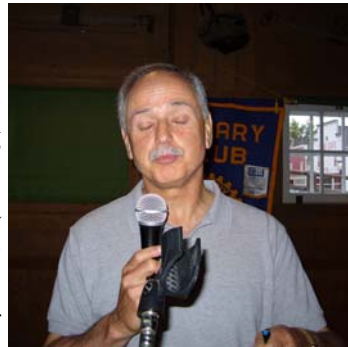
MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

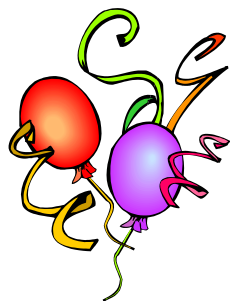
