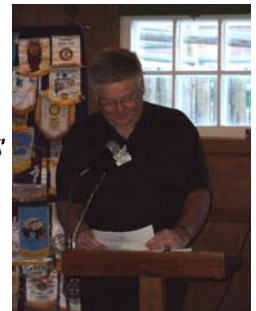

Hey Rotary ! I'm Moving!

My dad never moved! Like so many others in his day, he worked one job and lived in the same house most of his life. Contrast that to my children who, while still in their late twenties have already worked for several companies, and have made their home in cities, wherever the jobs are to be found. I guess no one needs to tell us, that today, we live in a fairly mobile society.

In a survey of 4000 Rotarians who resigned from Rotary clubs, 30% indicated that their resignation was due to RELOCATION. Interestingly enough, 9 out of 10 of these relocating Rotarians indicated that they still wanted to belong to Rotary in their new community. But when surveyed, only 2 out of 10 were actively pursuing membership in a new club. Rotary needs these knowledgeable Rotarians, and they need Rotary! Assisting our Relocating Rotarians to a new club should be at the top of our Retention efforts. Here are a few ways you can help those Rotarians relocating to other areas.

- 1) Give the Rotarian a Letter of Recommendation from your Club.*
- 2) Use the RI Website Club Locator to assist the Rotarian in finding a suitable new club.*
- 3) Have your Club Secretary or the Rotarian complete the RI Member Relocation form online at RI's Website.*
- 4) Or assist the Relocating Rotarian fax or mail the RI Member Relocation form.*
- 5) Make direct contact with the new club.*
- 6) Following up on the relocated Rotarian can help them remember how important Fellowship is in Rotary and where to find it.*
- 7) Your club can propose a Relocating Rotarian for membership in the new club.*
- 8) A Rotarian in the new club can propose a "transferring" Rotarian.*
- 9) Extend a leave of absence so the Rotarian can belong to your Rotary Club until they find a suitable Rotary Club to join in the new community.*

Some might reason that the burden of responsibility should be on the Relocating Rotarian to find the new club on their own. I'd suggest that we are Rotarians today because Rotarians in our club care enough to keep us in Rotary, no matter where we roam.
