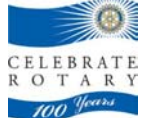

It was a busy meeting with three of my favorite

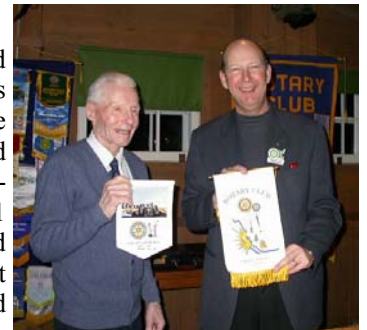

As we traded banners Ross informed me that he had been a Rotarian for 41 years and during that time had 100% attendance. Remarkable!! Glad to have met you Ross.

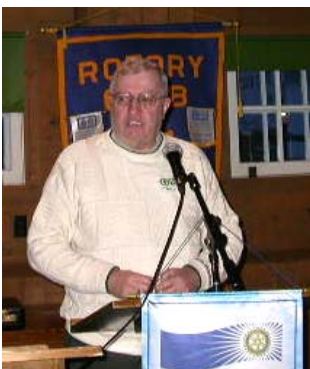
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events. An initiation, a banner swap and a classification talk. Who could ask for anything more?

Din's eye for detail served him well as he picked out members not attired in Rotary pin and name badge.

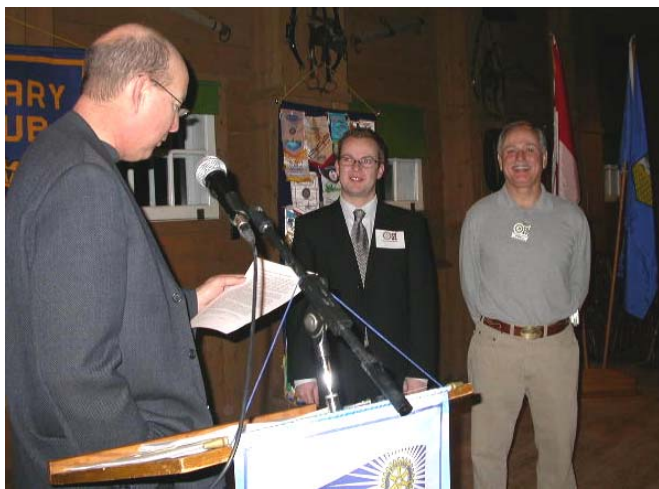

by Frances Mayes.

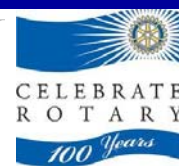
