A brief history was provided of the Rotary Foundation, which looks after Rotary international work. The permanent fund is Rotary's endowment fund started by Arch C. Klumph. In addition there are ambas-

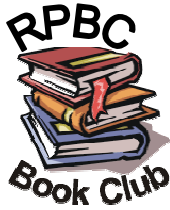

sadorial scholarships, GSE and matching grants. In 1989 \$1 million was contributed to start the individual grants program.

The Rotary Foundation is managed by 13 trustees and includes 3 segregated funds: annual programs, polio plus and the permanent fund. The annual fund is invested for 3 years and provides 2 streams of income.

The Canadian income tax rules allow a maximum of 75% of income to be donated annually to registered charities. There is no limit in the year of death and a deduction of up to 100% of income can be claimed with any excess applied to a prior year.

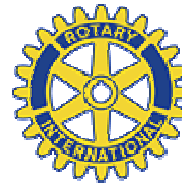
Marion Barrett had \$1 happy for her upcoming trip to Italy.
