They have a mandate that they will only do murder mysteries. The Theatre group has been around for over 30 years, and six years ago they were forced to look for a new space. They have moved into the

base of the Calgary tower and have taken over the old Palliser theatres. They usually try to do 4-5 plays per year.

Doug Hood: -Motion from Community Services: That the RCCHP support the William Watson Lodge Living with Cancer Fundraiser for \$4000. Seconded by Al Black, voted and passed- Motion from Community Services: That the RCCHP provide \$1700 in support of a dinner and sandwich making for the Calgary Drop in Centre. Seconded by Joan, voted and passed.

-Doug and Peter met with Chrysalis and they are in the process of raising \$250 000 for a new support centre. The Chrysalis 3H project has been approved for a "site visit" from a RI trustee. The budget for the project is \$250K and if it is approved RCCHP will provide \$15K and the RC of New Delhi Metro will contribute \$10K.

Jim Hennessy: -James Short School- A kin-



dergarten to grade three school in the Forest Lawn area. The committee would like to give them \$7500 now, and then possibly some more if there is any more money left over after all of the other commitments are taken care of. Jim motioned like to ask the board for \$7500 to support the school to cover off the list of items from their "wish list." Doug Hood seconded, voted and passed.

Gary Brown: -Global Disabilities Foundation- Discussion surrounded supporting the GDF financially and as a service project, loading containers for Vietnam. Gary presented a motion that International Services Committee make a donation of \$2,000.00 to the Global Disabilities Foundation to assist in the purchase of wheel chairs.

-X- Ray Machine- International Service is looking at teaming up with a Rotary club in Sherwood Park and in India to assist in the purchase of an X-Ray machine. Gary motioned "That International Services Committee make a donation of \$5,000.00 to the Rotary Club of Sherwood Park for the X ray project, provided the required finding is secured by July 1, 2006." Voted and passed. Closing Bell sounded at 8:13 AM

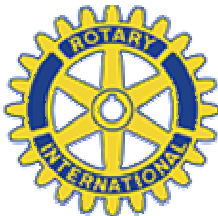
Joan Bedard- congrats on winning the 50/50 and a result received a cheque for \$66.00.

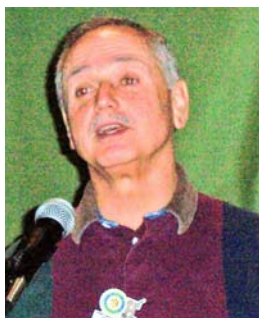

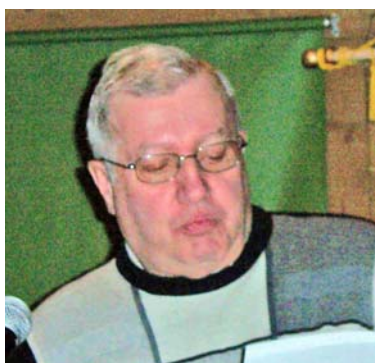
