YOUTH JUSTICE SOCIETY

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Max introduced our guest Denise Blair from the Youth Justice Society. She is the founder of the society and the goal is to reduce the amount of crime by youths and focus on rehabilitation.

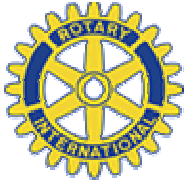
The society works with about 400 volunteers in the city, with 130 areas, and provides offenders with alternative punishments to the traditional court system. If the crime is done by a first or

second time offender they can be referred out to the youth justice committee. They will then meet with the young person and their family and will determine an agreement that the youth must complete. If they complete them the charges are withdrawn.

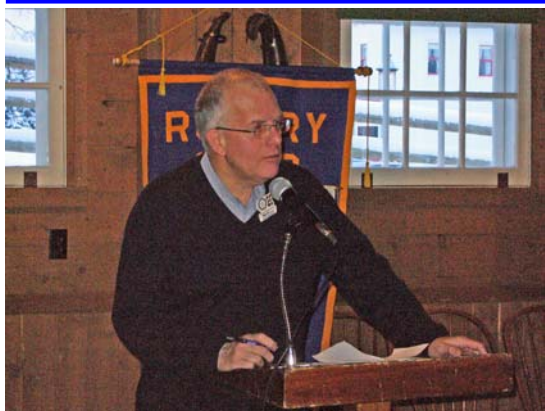

Sheriff Martin Harvey: You're BUSTED!

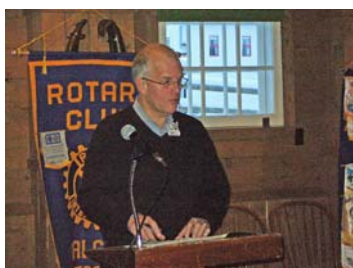


The one that we fear the most today is Martin Harvey:

With the inclement weather Martin Harvey thankfully stepped in for Jim



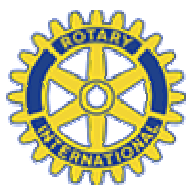
50/50 JACK POT
