As of May 31, 2006 with total assets of \$293 000 and there is a good amount of it that is set

aside for the museum project. All the bills are paid and there are no outstanding liabilities. Cash flow for the year was approximately \$175000 which was generated from all of the funding opportunities. There are still five people that are outstanding with unpaid dues and payment would be appreciated. The Community services committee have spent most of their budget, International Service have spent over half of the money with some pending projects waiting to be approved, and Vocational is waiting on approval for several projects as they are using casino funds and need approval from AGLC for funding over \$1000.

The committee provided some money to purchase an x-ray machine in India, Assisting Global Disabilities Foundation with some funding for wheel chairs, committed to two projects in the Dominican Republic- upgrade some computers and water filters, 5360 micro credit initiative, a sonogram for a hospital in India, the 3H project, and Polio plus.

There were various projects such as: - monies for GW Skeane for \$15 000, raised \$360 for the family night at the school, \$1000 for the Interact club with Lord Beaverbrook school, "It's a crime not to read"- \$2500 for a project with the Calgary Library and Police and reading with kids, Motive Action \$2500, support the Rotary Club of Canmore with RYLA, \$7500 for James Short Memorial School, The 4 Way Speech contest. They have had their last meeting for the year and it was quite successful.

There have been some grants that are tied up in Gaming, but some of the projects that have been completed are: The William Watson Lodge, Calgary Drop In Centre, Mead-

owlark Park Community Association in helping re-build their playground, Learning Disabilities Association, Royal Canadian Legion, Parental Support Association of Calgary, and the Epilepsy Association. Some sweat equity projects are Salvation Army Christmas Kettles, William Watson Lodge, the Road Clean up, and the Drop in centre

SUNSHINE REPORT



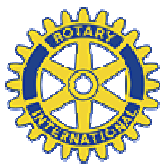
Sunshine Report:

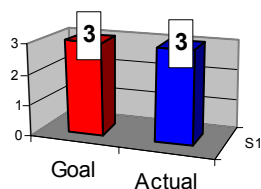

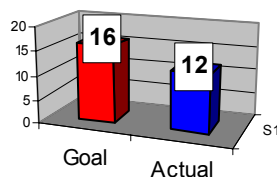

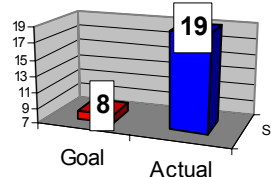
