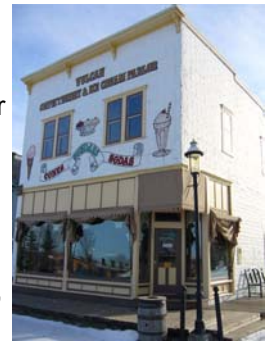
THE MUSEUM

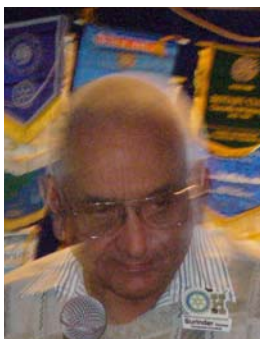


THE SHERIFF-AGAIN! PAIN
