Marion is obviously a "doer". She is on the advisory boards of Bow Valley College



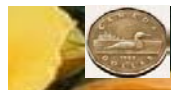

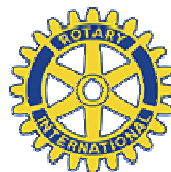
Happy Bucks featured Dennis Tillotson having his first grandchild, Bill Hope and his joy of skiing, and Jim Hennessey on Curling.

Two tickets were offered for Vertigo Theatre on April 24. The scramble was incredible. Suzanna was picked for the 50/50 draw and didn't make it!

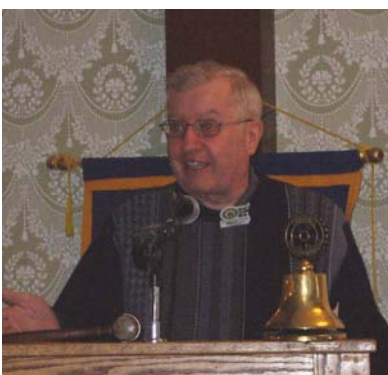
Sheriff McKeown: You're BUSTED!

The Sunshine Bucks came up with special mention of Barry Jarvis. Someone wondered where Helen Buchanan was. She is preparing to have her first child in June.



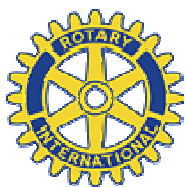
50/50 JACK POT
