story of Rotary in action in Uganda, helping one village at a time. Talk about need? 45% of the people of Africa live on less than \$1.00 per day. 30% live on \$2.00 per day. The former can hardly make it. The latter make it.

Poverty, ignorance, disease kill 30,000 people per day. Poor health and early death walk hand in hand on the way to find and retrieve water.
