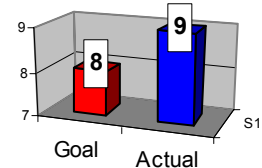

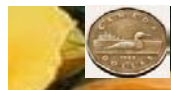

2. Our club donates \$2,000 to the Learning Disability Association of Calgary towards Camp Amicus. This camp encourages interaction skills. The motion was passed.
3. Our club donates \$5,000 to the Wellness on Wheels Health Bus. This bus served 8,800 people last year. The motion was passed.

Treasurer David McKeown moved that:

1. Our club gives \$1,200 to Mah and Company to defray our club's audit costs. The motion was passed.
2. Our club gives \$2,000 to incoming District Governor Raju Paul to defray some of his costs. The motion was passed

Van from South Calgary announced their 8th annual art auction and dinner May 12 from 6:00 to 11:00. Cost is \$80 per person. The event will include silent and live auction items. This event has raised \$440,000 over the years.
