With claims to fame including introducing Wynne to our club, Jeannette Pyle took the stage to present a look at the future of Heritage Park. A video, which was prepared for potential donors, entitled "It's About Time", with commentary by Darrel Janz, was shown to start Jeanette's presentation.

The capital fund raising campaign has a target of \$55 million. The ambitious project will increase parking spaces from 650 to 1,700. Immediately outside the park will be a wetlands and major buildings including a CP Rail Station and town square with green space. Pay stations will be positioned in the parking area for ease of entry of those wishing to see the inside of the park.

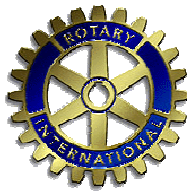

A new Heritage block will include an office complex from Medicine Hat, an apothecary and the Number 7 Fire Hall from Calgary. These exhibits will expand the Park's historical coverage from the current period 1864 - 1914 to include the 1930's and 1940's as Alberta entered the oil and gas era.

A new transportation exhibits complex will have 75,000 square feet of hands on interpretation for the young and young at heart. There will be new retail operations, a CP Rail cafeteria, new restaurant with patio and room for a 400-person banquet. The Park will have capacity for a 1,200 guest stand up cocktail party. An interpretative brewery will ultimately produce Livingston lager for guests to interpret. A Founder's Lounge will be available for major donors.

To date \$42 million has been raised. Summer 2008 will see completion of this phase of the expansion.
