Al Hardstaff proudly announced the playground we helped build in Meadowlark Park will be displaying a sign and Rotary emblem recognizing our contribution.

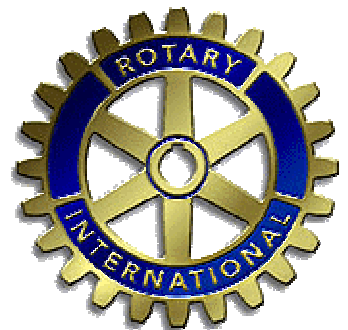
Road Clean Up

Al Hardstaff happy to be to a hot rod run to Radium, B.C.

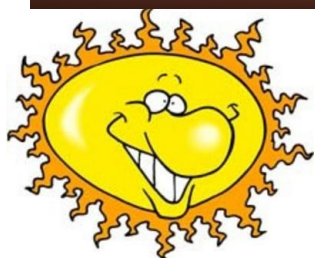
Asha was happy to have her special guests from India
