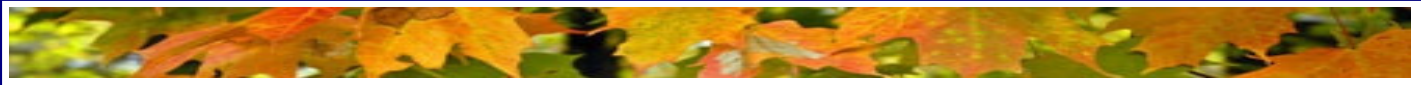
Her presentation was most interesting and a top-drawer speaker for our meeting.

A MOTION OF SUPPORT:

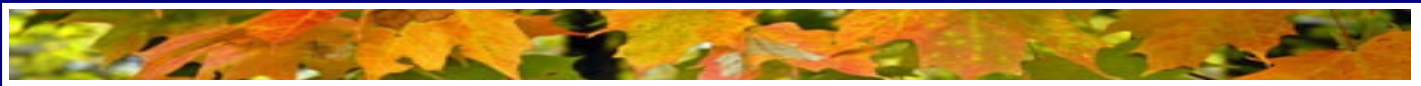
Harry Kim, Chair of the Community Service Team introduced a motion to provide \$1,000 in support of the Veteran's Food Bank. It was approved unanimously.

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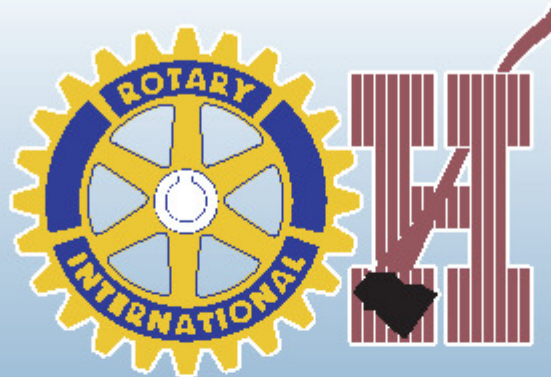
