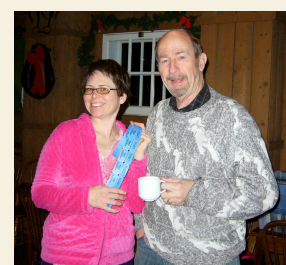
HAPPY BUCKS
