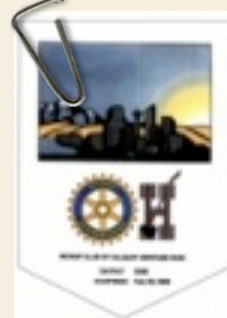
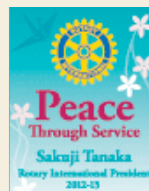

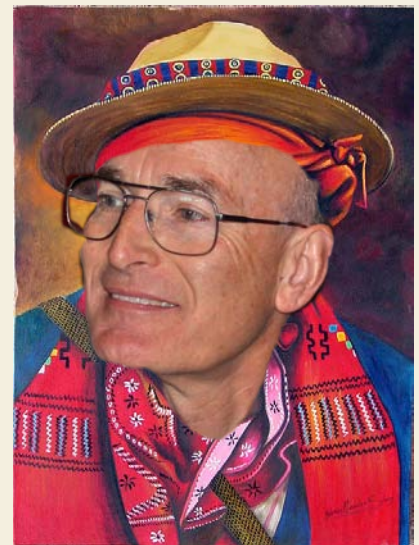

DENNIS TILLOTSON, COMMUNITY SERVICE:

14 organizations reviewed, selected and supported during the year. \$27,150 spent leaving a residue of \$21.

These include: Neighbourhood Link, Poppy Fund, Boys and Girls Clubs of Calgary, Peace by Piece Quilt Guild, Victory Church, Association for Rehabilitation of the Brain Injured, Inn From the Cold, Centre of Hope, Inglewood Wildlands Park signage, BodyWhys Canada, Calgary Hospice, Calgary Cerebral Palsy, Little Warriors, and Discovery House.

There is informal approval for a District Matching Grant, and perhaps with Alberta Community Initiatives Grant we could have \$10,000 for Discovery House.

The initiative for the Community Services Vision Statement and selection criteria will carry forward to the next year.

An agreement is in place for a \$1500 commitment for the next year for ARBI.

There will accrue \$2500 for Discovery House while awaiting decisions on grants.

Dennis expressed his thanks to the Community Service Committee for their hard work and support.

PETER HARDING, VOCATIONAL SERVICE:

Thank you to my committee members,

Harry Kim, Garry Gray, Ted Wood, LeRoy Neilson, Brad Sewall, Brad Wellicome and Brian Semeschuck.

Funds allotted to our committee this year - \$14,025

Fund spent or committed - \$12,460

Residual carrying forward to next year - \$1,565

With the students at Juno Beach High School we helped 3 students gain self-confidence and self-esteem through the RYPEN program.

We saw 2 students enhance their leadership skills for their family, school and community through the RYLA weekend.

We provided the adventure of a lifetime to a young student who spent 4 days in Ottawa learning about our political system. She will be presenting to our club later this month.

We have developed an association of students in the form of the Interact Club for the betterment of themselves and their school and community. We are also laying the groundwork for the interaction between this group and the next level of Rotary, the Calgary Rotaract Club for a combined charitable project with the Calgary Food Bank

Through our scholarship connection with SAIT we help a single parent complete the 2nd year of their education journey enhancing their lives and the lives of those around them including their children.

Through our involvement with GW Skene School we gave a student body of underprivileged children the joy of art and music, the growth skills of computer literacy, the opportunity to enjoy sports and recreation. Strong minds and strong bodies.

We also gave the teachers the tools and equipment so they could succeed in helping these young people.

In summary we helped create better students, solid citizens, future leaders of families and communities and future Rotarians. In total a pretty great year.
