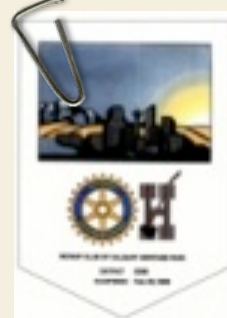

KIMBERLY SEARCH AND RESCUE - PETER REID

President Doug Hood introduced Peter Reid with Kimberly Search and Rescue.

This is a serious business; run by volunteers. 60% of Canadian rescues occur in BC. Peter loves the outdoors and believes in giving back.

The organization utilizes the ICS platform, which is a military command structure. The priority of safety is: searchers, bystanders and then the persons to be rescued. It is stressful because it is often the recovery of bodies. They locate, assess, stabilize and transport.

Volunteers undergo 1 year of basic training and must demonstrate they can survive in the wild. There is also specialty training for rope and swift water.

Volunteers are deployed to natural disasters, missing person, evidence searching and also education of the public.

Peter then shared some call out stories and warnings. The perfect back country ski slope is also the perfect avalanche slope. The avalanche hears and then cols like cement. Peter warned people to check their transceiver batteries before every trip.

Swift water is also a serious hazard.

Peter was thanked by Dennis.
