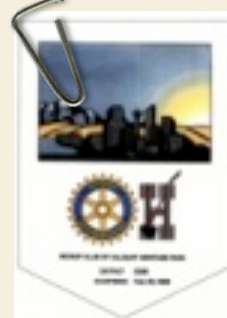

Al Hardstaff recognized the name of Stompin' Tom.

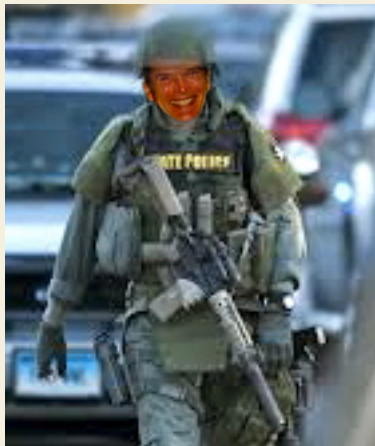

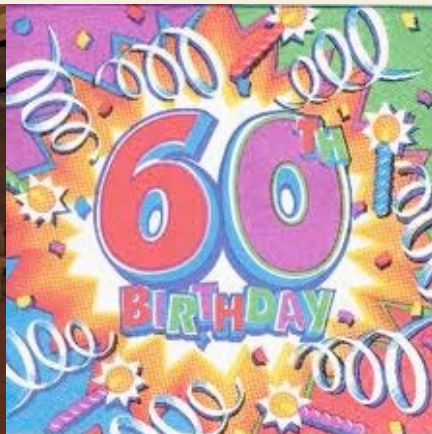
