1. To allocate \$2,500 to Discovery House to provide furnishings. We will apply for a District matching grant of \$2,500 and then a Community Initiatives Programs matching grant of \$5,000. If unsuccessful with any of the grant requests, we will still provide \$2,500. This motion was seconded by Mark Rowe and passed.
2. To provide \$2,500 of restricted funds to BodyWhys Youth Canada for program manuals, tip sheets and supplies to use in schools for education on eating disorders. This motion was seconded by John Radermacher and passed.
3. To allocate \$3,000 to the Association for Rehabilitation of the Brain Injured for training programs. \$1,500 will be paid this year and \$1,500 next year. Jamie Powell will be the director next year of community service. Seconded by Bob Sadler and passed.

Raju discussed Rotary finances. From club member dues \$55 goes to District and \$53 to R.I., with the balance to our club. Dues plus interest pay for R.I. administration. Some of the president's costs have been eliminated over the years.
