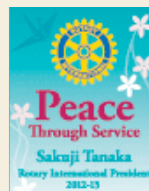

ROTARY MINUTE -RAJU PAUL

We are all members of RCCHP which is one of 34,297 clubs who are members of Rotary International and we all have a voice in formulating and/or modifying the RI Constitution and Bylaws, standard Club Bylaws as well as items contained in the Manual of Procedure. This happens at Rotary's parliamentary session which is held every three years at the Council on Legislation or COL. The 2013 COL was held last week in Chicago and lasted for five days.

The clubs in each of the 532 Rotary Districts elect one person to represent them. The Council discuss and vote on the enactments which have been submitted by Clubs and Districts. A few of the enactments considered at this COL dealt with club attendance recording criteria- engaging in a club service project is currently an option for attendance credit. This COL has added "other activities" as well. Participation in our



Club's Golf tournament is an activity which would qualify for attendance. Another enactment dealt with RI dues which is going from the current \$25 a Rotarian to \$28 in 2016-17.

These are just two examples. The five days are jam packed with suggestions and proposals from Clubs and Districts.
