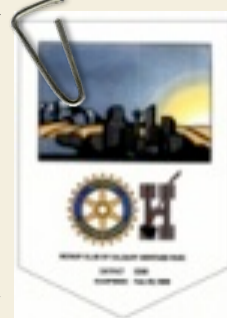
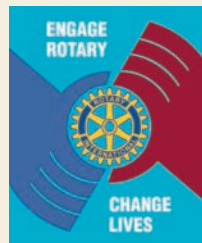

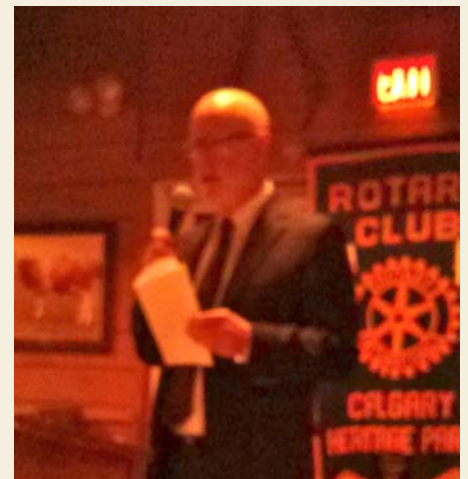
PROGRAM

GORD LOWE

Mark Rowe introduced our speaker, Gord Lowe.

Gord was an Alderman for the past twelve years but did not run again this year. He likes Rotary because it is not political. He outlined the life of an Alderman and how the City runs. He represents the whole City and not just the ward he is elected for. Alderman look after the big picture and cannot go into specific departments, like Roads, to get something done. They are Governors and not Managers (who run the City).

City Council has fourteen members plus the Mayor. The Aldermen are assigned to various committees that report to the council. Committee meetings are open to the public, they may listen but not speak. Committees make recommendations to the Council and council makes the decision.





The city has an Audit Committee which informs committees or departments if something needs adjusting. There is no Auditor General like the Province or the Feds who reports to the public and not to City administration. Planning is getting more expensive as the City expands. Any addition to City services are paid for by tax payers through a rate base.

Enmax has been great for the City. ATCO has no agreement with the City. That means if the City Road department puts in a new pavement, ATCO can dig it up the next day to install their services.

The City has no Charter, it would take seven years to get one in place.

The Club was very interested in Gord's talk because he held nothing back.

He was thanked by Joe Klassen who presented an eyesight donation on behalf of the Club.

DOUG KYLE

Douglas ("Doug") Kyle (born July 22, 1932 in Toronto, Ontario) is a former long-distance runner. He represented Canada at the 1956 and 1960 Summer Olympics. As a resident of Calgary, Alberta he won the silver medal in the men's 10,000 metres event at the 1959 Pan American Games, and the bronze in the 5,000 metres.

Kyle ran track while at student at the University of Michigan.

Doug transferred to our club from RC Calgary South.

He is an active member of St. Peter's Anglican Church.

At the club, he sits on the Community Service committee and the Grants Committee.
