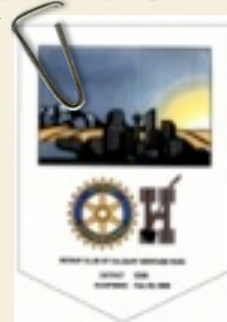
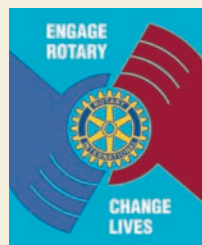

The primary plant that El Molino operates is in Claresholm and boasts 40,000 feet of highly modernized production of many of the foods we buy from Costco, Safeway, Coop and others. El Molino's plant processes 1000 lbs of dehydrated corn every hour... wow! They produce 98 products which now includes cabbage rolls, (he showed us the video twice) which he seems very proud about. But it's not all work, Harry, Laura, Melissa and Jasen enjoy many activities including skiing, sledding, quading, fly fishing, golfing and vacations which recently included a trip to Korea. Now we know why modernizing the plant is important, it helps balance your life when you have as much fun as the Kim's do.
