Doubling as second string QB, in the fourth quarter, Mark Rowe announced the birthday of Long



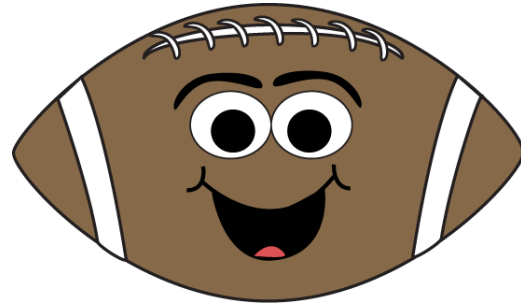
Rotary International District Grants
