Guest Speaker:

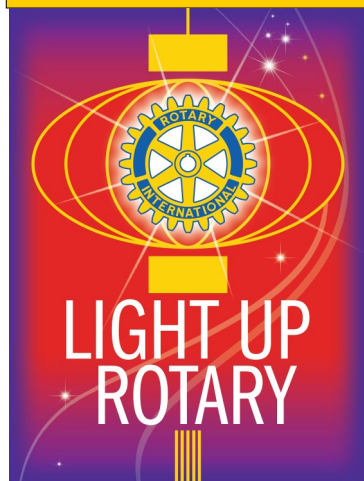
