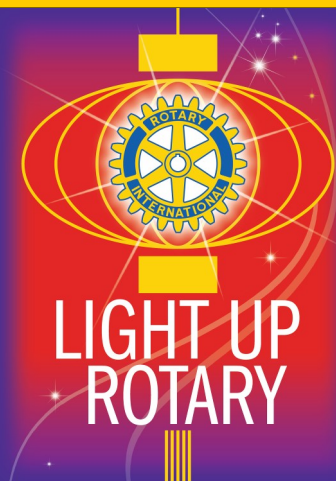
Bill Skinner spoke of the Guatemala Project. He has the support of Heritage Park, Olympic, Downtown, Sarcee, South and Centennial Rotary Clubs. The project has moved beyond the water filters and stoves into being an actual sustainable industry. They have a contract to build filters for communities surrounding the area through partnerships with a church group from the United States. The group has been able to afford a larger space to manufacture their product by the increase of their business. They are being trained on Project Management skills to help build their business and they are offering a greatly discounted offer to get the product out to the market and hopefully create more demand.

Bill also explained he was in the process of taking another group down to view the facility and also do some work plus arrange some vacation time. If anyone is interested please let Bill know.

Jim Coyle spoke of his experiences as a Coach to help mentor and coach peers at his work. He was offered the opportunity when he was working for BMO in 2000. He participated in 3 day weekend sessions in Vancouver over a 5 month period to become certified coach. He had to learn various methods of coaching. The first level was to understand what values the individual had, what they saw for their future and what they thought was keeping them from obtaining their potential.

Balanced coaching focused on Core Issues, Jim gave an example of how if you thought your boss was a jerk, that by changing your physical position moving to another spot and look at the situation differently you may see the issue differently.

The third method was Process Coaching, this coaching relied on observation of body position, anxiety, and tension of the individual and developing methods to reduce the stresses in the individual. He gave an example of how he had to coach someone to pass and he danced her around the room to help her relax.
