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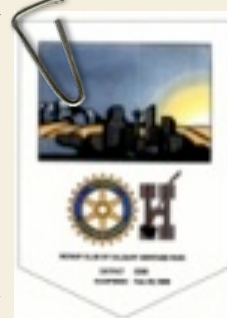
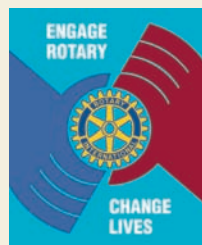
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MEETING NOTES

MINUTE PEOPLE

PAT MEADOWS ON PULMONARY FIBROSIS—Pulmonary Fibrosis affect 30,000 Canadians per year and yet it is not well known by the general public. Currently 50% of her lungs are permanently damaged.

Pat was diagnosed with Pulmonary Fibrosis on April 4th last year. The disease is progressive and fatal, with life expectancy 3-5 years.
