Presentation:

Doug Kyle introduces our speaker today Calgary emergency women's shelter Community coordinator Maria Felix.

They are here to support mothers and kids up to 18 years. Although supporters would like to, it is hard to tour, as its an undisclosed location.

They offer many programs beyond the shelter. Education and counselling for men. Healthy relationships program for teens. Community action plan to corporate and church groups; two hour workshop on family violence and how to spot and support. There are over 16000 domestic complaints in Calgary per year, meaning many families are in crisis.

They have a 6.5 million budget, which is needed for the 16k per day to keep the shelter operating. There is no financial burden to the patrons of their services.

Some questions: Is family violence on the increase, yes, and there are also cultural issues.

Why women stay in a troubled relationship is a complex concept. The cycle can repeat. And the change in lifestyle and displacement from family home is difficult.

Average stay is about 21 days. They have counsellors for men, as well as the woman and the children.

There is continued support from the outreach program.
