For our special polishing plates duty, Harry chose Shelia Tyminski, as our past president had been so busy chairing meetings last year that she had avoided doing this for some time!!

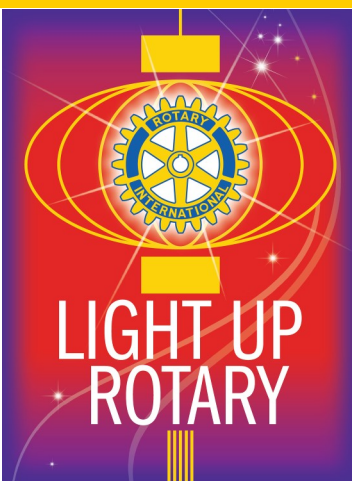
At 7:20am – Harry called the meeting to order.
