Well done RCCHP and we have amazing representation from the club!

Well it is hard to believe that our Annual Rotary Golf Tournament is coming up quickly and it will be held on June 23rd 2016 at 1.00 pm at the Redwood Meadows Golf Course. Jim Sawers gave us an update and we are 80% towards our goal and the tournament will open up on May 1st to foursomes. We are still shooting for 100% participation from the club and we are currently at 52%. There are a number of volunteer opportunities available and this will be communicated shortly.

Doug Hood just got back from Puerto Vallarta and visited the Volcanes Community Education Program and Sewing Project. Volcanes is about 45 minutes from PV and they have completed the re-finishing of a school and have created an after school program for kids. They have the opportunity to learn additional English skills as well as computer work and our donations have been going towards the subsidizing of the salaries of the teachers. The Sewing School is a little different in that the city donated the building, a Calgary Organization called "Sewing Seeds" donated the sewing machines, and there are 30 students that take a six month program to learn to sew. This gives the students a skill in which they can generate income for their families and earn a living.

This was a very busy meeting and next on the agenda we had a series of motions to pass:

That the RCCHP donate \$1000 to support the Calgary Rotary Challenger Park 11th Annual Golf Tournament to be held at Silverwing Golf Course on August 31st 2016.

Seconded by Graham, voted all in favour and passed.

That the RCCHP Vocational Services Committee support GW Skene school in the amount of \$1000 to aid in the equipping of a calming room to help students cope with stress they encounter at school.

Seconded by Daryl, voted all in favour and passed.

That the RCCHP Vocational Services Committee support Ernest Manning's High School Robotics Program in the amount of \$3000 to support the building of a robot. Total cost of the program is \$39,000.

Seconded by Graham, voted all in favour and passed.

That the RCCHP Vocation Services Committee to support a SAIT Scholarship program in the amount of \$1500 for 2017. This will support a 2nd year student that is a resident of Alberta, and a single parent in financial need.

Seconded by Asha, voted all in favour and passed.

The next item we had on the agenda was our 50/50 and Darryl came forward to see who was in the running for the \$76 pot. Brad Wellicome had the lucky ticket, but his luck ran out as he didn't pick the joker! Too bad Brad but a very smooth rendition of the 4 way test!
