Rotary  Rotary Opens Opportunities

In the beginning:

President Christine called the meeting to order at 7:00 a.m., after a rousing discussion about Zoom background pictures and the challenges of cameras.



District Assistant Governor David Leslie was welcomed as the only visitor or guest.

Peter Leigh gave Thanks, provided the sunshine report and told a humorous story.

Our speaker, Jodie Eckert, was introduced by Sheila Tyminski.

Jodie is the Manager of the Rotary Alberta Youth Entrepreneurship Camp (RAYEC). Community Futures Alberta started the camp 23 years ago as part of their strategy to help start and grow rural businesses.

The goal of RAYEC is drive rural economic growth through youth entrepreneurship and leadership.

In 2018, Rotary being an official partner and the name of the camp changed to Rotary Alberta Youth Entrepreneurship Camp. The partnership has already resulted in 14 clubs (including ours) sponsoring students to attend this summer experience.

Students, ages 13-15, apply to attend camp and selections are based on how they demonstrate leadership and community service.

During the 7-day camp, participants develop a business idea, write

business plans, and then put their plan to work. Servus Credit Union is the banker for the camp providing loans to the students for their projects. With their seed money, the students have a short trip to Medicine Hat to buy their raw material. Once back at camp, they have a couple of days to manufacture their products in time for Business Day.

On Business Day, parents, sponsors and other visitors have the opportunity to purchase the products the participants have created. Once their loan is repaid, the profit is theirs. Camp isn't all work though. After 4 p.m. every day, the participants take advantage of the recreation opportunities at Eagles Nest Ranch.

What is the impact of the camp? Jodie told us

- 94% of students said the camp had significant and positive impact on their education/career

- 75% of students attended post secondary education

- 30% of students have a business or have been involved in a start up

- 68% of students are involved in business in rural Alberta

- 91% of students are involved in leadership roles after the camp

Jodie asked us to do four things:

- Spread the word about RAYEC

- Sponsor a student (our club is already doing this)

- Volunteer (Brian Gentles and Martin Harvey have been volunteers)

- Visit the camp on Business Day (August 14 2021)

After a very interesting question and answer session, Sheila thanked Jodie for her presentation.

Speaking of Thank you, this week Eve Robertson taught us to say Thank you in Gaelic - Tapadh leat

The Club approved four resolutions:

Motion by Eve Robertson/Sheila Tyminski - On behalf of the International Service Committee I move that RCCHP reaffirms the allocation of \$5,000 (committed in May 2019) and provides an additional \$400 in order to reach the new D5360 requirement of US\$4,000 for the DDF application in support of the Global Grant – Save Lake Atitlan Phase 3.

Motion by Eve Robertson/Bill Skinner - On behalf of the International Service Committee I move that RCCHP provides C\$1500 to Rotary Club Los Altos Quetzaltenango, Guatemala, for their PPE for medical personnel treating Covid-19 programme.

Motion by Eve Robertson/Velma Noble - On behalf of the International Service Committee I move that RCCHP provides \$1000 to the Rotary Club of Calgary Downtown for their Global Grant: Toward the elimination of cervical cancer in rural Guatemala.

Motion by John Radermacher/Brian Gentles - On behalf of the Community Services Committee, I move that the Rotary Club of Calgary Heritage Park donate \$1,500 to the Calgary Poppy Fund.

Brad Sewall presented the Nominating Committee report. There are two vacancies for next year's Board. We are still seeking a Secretary and a Director of Youth Services. If either position interests you, please speak to a member of the nominating committee (Brad S., Christine M., Doug M., or Brad W.)

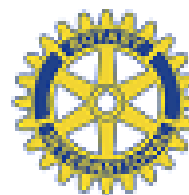
Watch for an email from Vocational Services for volunteers for mock interviews at St. Mary's University on November 25
