In the beginning:

Guest Speaker: Dr Paulose Paul

Our guest speaker today was Dr. Paulose Paul MD, FRCSC and he was introduced by Ginny. Dr. Paul is currently the Zone Clinical Lead for Orthopedic surgery for the Edmonton Zone. Dr. Paul began his presentation by taking us back to 2004 and the challenges associated with timely access for orthopedic patients. This led to the proposal of a pilot study to AHS that would be driven provincially by the Alberta Bone and Joint Health Institute. The “New Way” would see patient referrals received centrally and farmed out to the first available surgeon, patients assessed centrally out of the hospital and all follow up arranged and delivered in a consistent manner. The results of the study were increased patient satisfaction, shorter time frames and reduced costs. As a result, the Edmonton Musculoskeletal Center, a not-for-profit private corporation, was

formed and AHS contracted the facility to manage all referral for hip and knee arthritis patients in Edmonton and the surrounding areas.

Between 2006 and 2016 significant advancements have been made in patient preparation and consolidation of surgical waitlists and many studies have been completed on hip and knee replacement outcomes. Going forward the goal is to develop an Orthopedic Campus that will provide centralized referral for all musculoskeletal problems in Edmonton and surrounding area, as well as providing screening clinics, patient preparation and comprehensive orthopedic care. Additionally, they are looking at providing the zone with a non-hospital surgical facility that will provide patients with improved access to surgical care.

Dr. Paul ended his presentation by addressing some of the misinformation by assuring us that this model does not provide private health care, but instead provides public health care in a more efficient and cost-effective manner.

On behalf of the club, Ginny thanked Dr. Paul and presented a certificate of immunization for a donation made to Polio Plus in his name.

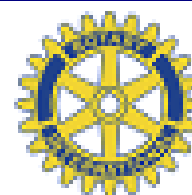
