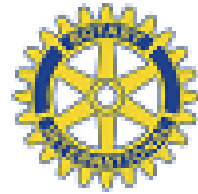
\$5 Bill Skinner: Reminder July 1st the 7th Avenue of Service Sustaining Environment as well June 5th is World Environment Day.
