Lorne Kelly greeted all Rotarians and Jamie Powell's rich baritone led us in the National Anthem. In lieu of a land acknowledgement, President Brad shared another entry from the book, 21 Things You May not Know about the Indian Act – Imposed Elected Chief and Council on the reserves. This change of leadership approach, designed for assimilation, removed the traditional leadership the reserve had and replaced it with a mandate to administer the Indian Act. They chief and council had limited bylaw powers and were re-elected every 2 years, reducing ability for any long term change.

Bill Hope introduced the many visitors and guests. Visiting Rotarians were Richard Broadwith & Manon Mitchell – Downtown Club, and guests of Ola, Ola's guests – Ray Domingo, Eartha Daliuag, Christine Joy Natanauan

Teresa shared the background of CSRC and described their four pillars: 1. World without Ageism; 2. World where seniors housing is safe and appropriate; 3. Communities where seniors thrive; 4. World where seniors receive support to live independently.

She then shared a video (with technical support by "Okay Joe" Brad) which reflected the some of the support resources they provide.

CSRC is not a seniors' center. They provide one on one connections for their clients. Their Social Work support provides Outreach and Senior Connect services. Their Senior Social Support assists with shopping, transportation, visitation and pet assistance. For more details see calgaryseniors.org.
