We had two guests, Richard Broadwith, a prospective member and Patrick MacDonald, a guest of Steve Dunk and the Speaker of the day. President Brad outlined the actions to be taken by the cadre for membership check-in. 1) Themes of responses will be sent out by email with the next issue of The Standard, 2) Rotary Activity Self Reporting Tool to be piloted by Executive to gauge engagement, 3) By-laws are being reviewed for participation flexibility and to distribute some of the responsibilities of leadership, and 4) Cadre will meet again and report back, as necessary. The club has decided to keep to their prior decision on donation to natural disasters. Leadership encourages members to donate as they see fit individually.

PROGRAM

Steve Dunk introduced our guest speaker. Patrick McDonald, P.Eng, is the Director of Sustainability at CAPP (Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers). Their role is to serve as a trusted voice for the Canadian oil industry working with all governments and parties, reducing upstream oil and gas emissions and ensure they play their role in the support of indigenous participation and prosperity. O&G makes up approximately 25% of emissions but we also have to take into account the value it brings economically etc. There will be variation and evolution of the energy mix used in Canada in years to come, as there has been in the past. Oil and Gas far outspends other similar industries with respect to sustainability. It has also increased production and lowered emissions intensity in recent years. Methane is an example of where the industry is on track to meet targets in part because of equipment and facility level detection and quantification of emissions. Patrick says that we need to focus on getting ahead in energy opportunities i.e. Blue Hydrogen. He was thanked by Steve.
