Linda Craig presented two banners, one from the Rotary Club of Cayucos California, presented to her by a dinner guest that they had hosted for the Convention, as well as a banner from a Wyoming Rotaract Club, given to her at the Convention.

Inspired by the banner exchange, but lacking a banner, Rotarian Ralph Williams presented the Club with a coffee cup from the Rotary Club of Arusha.
